IN MEMORIAM: EVELYN OTTEN MACDONALD

It is with great sadness that the Westerleigh Improvement Society notes the passing of our beloved former secretary, Evelyn MacDonald.

She served as the archivist for the Port Richmond High School Alumni Association and as an historic guide at Richmondtown Restoration. Her busy lifestyle included attending events and classes at the YMCA and the JCC.

In her professional life, Evelyn was a registered nurse who worked for the Visiting Nurse Association of Staten Island for many years.

SEWER PROJECT AND WESTERLEIGH PARK UPDATE



As the cold weather approaches, contractors working on the capital projects on Jewett Avenue and side streets as well as Westerleigh Park will continue working as weather permits.

Final work on the sewer project is just about completed with the exception of the resurfacing of all streets. It appears most of that work will be completed in the spring. Initial reports indicate

success – rainfall has been diverted into the catch basins and the flooding that was so prevalent is now a memory.

Work in Westerleigh Park has been sporadic to date. A large section of the park below Willard Avenue down to the bandstand has been fenced off. According to projections from the Parks Department the project should be completed in 2016. Stay tuned. ❧

REMINDER FROM THE PARKS DEPARTMENT

In the past many new street trees have been requested by Westerleigh residents and have been planted in numerous locations, where appropriate.

EWASTE – DISCARDING YOUR ELECTRONICS

If you're one of those persons who holds on to things long after their usefulness – specifically with long-obsolete electronic items – then suddenly find you can't put them out for curbside pickup ... well, New York City finally has some good news for you. It's now easier than ever to get rid of those e-waste items. A whole lot easier.

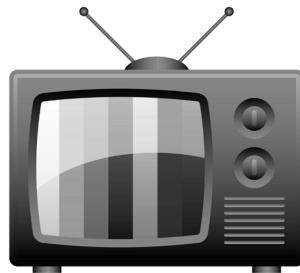
The Department of Sanitation has instituted a number of programs that make getting rid of those previously impossible-to-discard items almost as easy as putting out your trash. Here are some of them:

1 A DSNY drop-off site is now open every Saturday and the last Friday of the month from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. at 1000 West Service Rd. in Travis, at the foot of the Muldoon Avenue exit of the West Shore Expressway.

2 If you are a senior citizen 65 or over or suffer from a

disability you can arrange a free pickup, courtesy of the non-profit group, Where To Turn. For Westerleigh residents, call Councilman Steven Matteo's office at (718) 980-1017 and make a request. You will be contacted by a member of Where To Turn within two weeks to arrange a pick-up date.

3 Special e-waste recycling events are still scheduled at regular intervals. For a complete listing of the dates, check the GrowNYC website.



What items qualify as e-waste? Here's a partial list:

DVR and VHS players, tapes and discs, bulky and heavy TVs, out-of-date computers and

You can be fined \$100 for placing certain electronics at the curb for disposal.

Secure Disposal

Lastly, if you're wondering about someone finding some sensitive, private information or personal data on your discarded items – don't. Electronic Recyclers International, the company that handles the e-waste operation for the city, assures everyone that all materials collected are shredded into miniscule pieces, under top surveillance standards that eclipse those of the Department of Defense. ☺

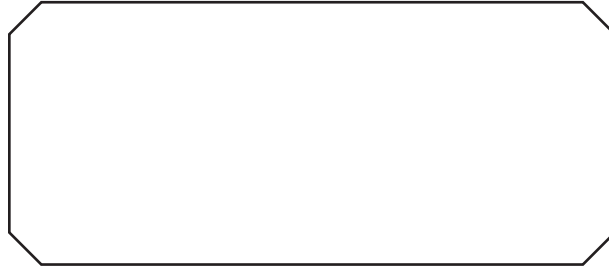
